# SPRING **ONLINE** MEETING

Our Spring Meeting will be held on Saturday, May 2nd, beginning at 9:30 a.m. As announced to all Alley Representatives in an e-mail communication from our Chief Joey, this meeting will be an ONLINE meeting. We will be using ZOOM technology to facilitate this meeting. If you are not familiar with Zoom, visit their tutorial page to see how it operates: https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/articles/206618765-Zoom-Video-Tutorials. Prior to the Spring meeting, all alley representatives will receive an invitation to the meeting via e-mail, with a session ID number and other instructions to help you connect to the meeting. We will also

provide some protocols for the meeting, such as how voting will occur, how speakers are acknowledged/identified, etc. We are encouraging alleys to gather together in a common meeting place and "attend" the meeting together, where possible. It will allow alley members to confer amongst themselves in side conversations, as necessary, and then cast votes as one entity. It might also be helpful to alley members who maybe are not tech savvy or do not have a good internet connection. If you know of other individuals interested in "attending" the meeting who are not associated with an alley, but live in the 7-

state region, please let Chief Joey Ovanin know to send them an invite (or you can pass along the information to them yourself). Our hope is that offering this meeting online will encourage more members to "attend."




Since we will not be meeting in person, it will be mandatory for all alleys that wish to have voting privileges to have their 2020 dues paid no later than April 2nd, which is 30 days before the meeting date of May 2nd. No exceptions. Dues may be paid by check or now by credit card online. See Membership Information Page on our website. Our **Treasurer and Sargeant-At-**Arms will need this time to make sure the roster of paid alleys is up to date. As always, only one person from each alley in good standing will have voting privileges, casting a vote on behalf of their alley's membership; but all members would be able to share their thoughts and are encouraged to participate.



Below are Proposals that have been submitted for consideration at our Spring Meeting. Please discuss these with your alley, and be prepared for your alley representative to cast a vote on behalf of your alley regarding these proposals.

**REGARDING COMPETITION:** Due to a reduction in attendance at recent MCA Round Ups, these are the FACTS: Each year the number of competitors in Make-up have drastically reduced. We need 12 judges to judge these competitions. We actually have more judges than competitors. Therefore, we propose that we combine ALL make-up categories into one. We will have 5 judges. These judges will each be well-versed in history, make-up application and overall appearance. Numbers are declining and we are getting as little as ONE competitor in any given category. Still, judges have to be secured for that ONE entry, and there is NO real competition and a medal is pretty much guaranteed. We realize most competitors are not open to pooling all types of clowns into one make-up category, and that this proposal has been turned down by the membership before.
